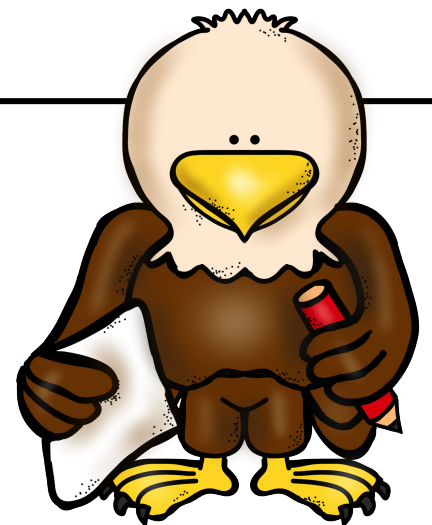
Counselor Corner
