

# Courseling News

This past month, I went into each classroom and gave a lesson on Respect. I really focused on what respect means and how to show it everyday here at school. We discussed what bustanders and upstanders are. I read stories that showed characters who showed respect and characters who didn't show respect. We brainstormed ideas on what to do when someone doesn't show respect. I taught the students that when someone is doing something they do not like they need to use their words. The phrase "please stop" is a key phrase to let others know they do not like what the other person is saying/doing. Every student is aware that if they hear those words they need to stop to show the other person we are respecting them and their words. We ended the lesson by decorating a heart cutout to build Ms. Rambala's Tree of Respect. Their heart cutout is decorated with ways they can show respect. "It takes a kind heart to be respectful", is my slogan for this year.

### Character Ed

These moments at the elementary level are super important in developing confident and kind kids of character. Each month we designate a character (social/emotional) trait that helps the students problem solve, strengthen social skills, and build good citizenship. I like to incorporate the monthly theme into everything that we do.
